Hello, my name is Shaunagh and I am the PCSO for Trimdon Colliery, Station and Deaf Hill. I am the single point of contact for Social Media within Peterlee Neighbourhood Team. This includes Facebook, Twitter and Keep in the Know. I can put status updates and reply to private messages through Peterlee Police's Facebook and Twitter page. Keep in The know is system where I can send private e-mails to members of the community within my beat and make them aware of crime spikes. Members of the public can also contact me through this system and make me aware of concerns they have privately. I am also the single point of contact for autism awareness within the Peterlee Beat Team. I am trained to use the Dot Peen Machine which is based in the crime prevention unit. I am DNA Spray trained for off road vehicles causing nuisance in the area.
